

Tsunami & Hurricane Emergency Preparedness

There is no tsunami season. Deep-sea earthquakes or underwater landslides most often generate tsunamis. If you are on or near the shoreline and feel the ground shaking, go inland or to higher elevations as soon as possible. If there is a warning, where will you go? Family or friends who live outside the evacuation zone? Shelters are limited and you will need to take your own supplies.

Emergency supplies – do you have what you might need on hand? Such as...

- Drinking Water
- Food (non-perishable that does not require cooking)
- Radio (battery powered)
- Flashlights or Lantern
- Spare Batteries
- First Aid Kit
- Prescriptions
- Pet supplies for pet owners

Be prepared for a loss of electricity and water. Fill extra containers with drinking water, and your tub with water.

Terms to know:

HURRICANE WATCH:
Possible within 36 hours

HURRICANE WARNING:
Possible within 24 hours

Constitutional Amendment Bill – VOTE NO!

This November, the public will have a chance to vote on this question:

“Shall the Legislature be authorized to establish, as provided by law, a surcharge on investment real property to be used to support public education?”

There are several important things to know about this bill:

- 1) This bill is **not** for only **residential** property over \$1M. That is what they want you to think.
- 2) This bill will affect ALL investment real estate. This includes:
 - 3) ALL residential investment properties
 - 4) Commercial properties
 - 5) Resort properties
 - 6) Agricultural properties

What does this mean for you?

Cost of living goes up for EVERYONE including:

- 1) Higher costs of groceries
- 2) Higher gas prices
- 3) Higher costs of services

The department of education gets the largest amount of funds from the general funds each year totaling almost \$3 BILLION dollars.

- 1) They haven't had an audit since the 60's.
- 2) They will not guarantee students or teachers will see any of the money that comes from this bill.
- 3) The bill has no cap on funds (BLANK CHECK), and NO guarantee of where the money will go.

Are you willing to let the STATE legislature have a BLANK CHECK and raise cost of living for ALL local people of Hawaii and also for any investors who provide land for small business and local farmers?
